A census is conducted every 10 years to count everyone living in the United States, including babies and young children. Responses help determine how billions of dollars in federal funding are distributed to states, counties, and local communities.

Some circumstances, like deployment, are unique to active duty service members and their families when it comes to completing the census. Make sure you know how to get counted correctly so you can support your community!
